That is why the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund (NLEOMF) has a capital campaign currently underway, entitled *A Matter of Honor: The Campaign for the National Law Enforcement Museum*, to raise \$80 million to build the largest and most comprehensive law enforcement museum in the world.

Presidential Leadership

Former Presidents George H.W. Bush and Bill Clinton are leading the efforts by serving as Co-Chairs of the *National Honorary Campaign Committee*. The former Presidents have made exceptional and lasting contributions to the law enforcement profession throughout their careers. President Bush played a leadership role in building the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial, including delivering the keynote address at both the groundbreaking and dedication ceremonies for the Memorial. President Clinton signed the public law to establish a National Law Enforcement Museum on federal land across from the Memorial.

National Honorary Campaign Committee

Working in conjunction with the former Presidents are members of the National Honorary Campaign Committee. The Honorary Campaign Committee is composed of former U.S. Senator Ben Nighthorse Campbell, who authored the law to establish the Museum, former U.S. Attorneys General Edwin Meese, Dick Thornburgh, Janet Reno, Benjamin Civiletti, William Barr and John Ashcroft, former Acting U.S. Attorney General Eric Holder, and best-selling author Joseph Wambaugh. Other national leaders and celebrities are also being recruited for this prestigious committee.
