Privacy Policy

General Information

The National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund respects the privacy of every individual who visits our websites. This Privacy Policy outlines information the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund may collect and how we may use that information.

The National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund will not use or disclose any personal information provided to us without consent except as described in this privacy policy, or as required by law.

This policy may be changed or updated from time to time.

Personal Information / Third-Party Suppliers and Service Providers

The National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund uses its best efforts to respect the privacy of its online visitors, supporters and constituents. On our site, we do not collect personally identifiable information from individuals unless they provide it to us voluntarily and knowingly. This information is used solely by the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund for internal purposes or for the purposes of the product or service for which the information was disclosed. In general, we do not require you to register or provide personal information to us in order to view our site, although registration may be required for certain products or services or sections of our site (such as posting an entry to the Officer Roll Call).

How We Use "Cookies"

A Word About Telemarketing
